VAN GOGH WATER COLOUR OFFERS MANY POSSIBILITIES

Van Gogh water colour is a versatile paint which can be used in many techniques, such as:

WATER COLOURS ON A DRY GROUND, OPTICAL COLOUR MIXING



On dry paper the effect of water colours is very different from the effect on paper that has been wetted beforehand. After drying, the colour sections have clear borders around them. In places where you apply a new colour on top of a colour that is already dry, you get so-called 'optical colour mixing'. Blue and yellow mixed optically become green, red and yellow become orange and blue and red become violet.

WATER COLOURS ON WET PAPER



Highly flowing areas of colour and very smooth colour transitions can be achieved by wetting water colour paper prior to painting. Leave the paper to absorb the water for a little while before the paint is applied. This wet-on-wet technique is used, for example, for skies.

WORKING WITH LIQUID MASKING FILM



If you want certain sections of the water colour to temporarily remain white, apply Liquid masking film in those sections before starting your work. When the masking film is dry you can paint over it. When the water colour is dry you can rub off the masking film from your work using a clean finger or eraser and the white of the paper is visible again. In this way you can also exclude certain areas of a dry layer of colour from the next colour layer. Liquid masking film is very difficult to clean from the hair of a brush. It is therefore advisable to apply Liquid masking film with a dip pen, cotton swab or the handle of a brush.

COMBINING WATER COLOURS WITH INDIAN INK



A drawing made using Indian ink is indelible when dry. With water colours you can paint over the dry drawing without the lines dissolving in the paint. As water colours are transparent, the drawing remains visible. You can apply the Indian ink with a dip pen or with a brush.



VAN GOGH BRUSHES

For every painting technique the right brush! There is a complete series of brushes available in the Van Gogh range. The Van Gogh brushes are made with care and craftsmanship, available in several forms and hair types of excellent quality from which to choose.

There are various brushes that have been especially developed for painting in water colours. These brushes are characterized by their ability to absorb and retain water.



Series 171 (red sable hair) and 130 (goat hair)



Series 120 (ox hair)



Series 191 and 305 (polyester fibres)

HOW TO LOOK AFTER YOUR BRUSHES?

- After use clean brushes well using soap and warm water.
- After cleaning reshape the hair.
- Store your brusnes in an upright position with the hair pointing up.

WATER COLOUR PAPER

The paper is a very important aspect of a water colour. Choose therefore high quality paper that absorbs the paint in the right manner and does not turn yellow over the years.



AUXILIARIES FOR **VAN GOGH WATER COLOUR**

Under the brand name Talens there are a number of auxiliaries especially for water colours available in various types of packaging. The auxiliaries are specifically geared to the requirements of painting with water colours. They ensure a good technical build-up and preservation of the work or can change the properties of the paint.



Liquid masking film 052: to temporarily leave areas on the painting white.



Gum Arabic 008: a medium for increasing the gloss and transparency of water colours.



Protecting spray 680 in a spray can or Water colour varnish matt 050 in a bottle.

EXPLANATION OF THE **SYMBOLS ON THE TUBES**

The following symbols are used:

1 LIGHTFASTNESS

+++ = at least 100 years lightfast under museum conditions.

The lightfastness of all colours has been tested according to the ASTM standard D4303.

2 COLOUR NUMBER

Instead of the colour name this number can be used. The colour number is always associated with the same colour name.

3 PIGMENT

Refers to the pigments used in het product.





The colours illustrated correspond with the real colours as much as possible.

Explanation of the symbols

Lightfastness

+++ = at least 100 years lightfast under museum conditions

The lightfastness of all colours has been tested according to the ASTM standard D4303.

The Colour Index

The pigments used in Van Gogh paint have been indicated according to the Colour Index. The Colour Index is an internationally used system for pigments and dyes that have been used in all types of paint (therefore also in artists' paint). The system is based on a number and name associated to the chemical structure. Originally the Colour Index was developed the U.S.A., hence the use of

English descriptions of the chemical class.

The abbreviations mean the following:

PW = pigment white

PY = pigment yellow

PO = pigment orange

PR = pigment red

PB = piament blue

PV = pigment violet

DO :

PG = pigment green

 $\mathsf{PBr} = \mathsf{pigment} \; \mathsf{brown}$

PBk = pigment black
